When we talk about **Operation Christmas Child**, you hear us say "Good News. Great Joy." Have you ever given that saying much thought?

During March and April, 22 of our women have been participating in a Bible study titled "Experiencing Contagious Joy" by Christa Kinde. We think about joy, but do we really understand what joy is?

- Joy is a gift from God. He is our reason for rejoicing. (We need to share this gift.)
- Believers have the commission to spread joy (Jesus) in the world in order to combat the insidious spread of hopelessness. (God calls us to pack shoeboxes as a way to tell others about Jesus so they will have hope.)
- True joy spreads as we live out God's way in our lives with such credibility that others move closer to purposely catch it. (You spread true joy when you pack shoeboxes; children realize that there must be something special about a person who gives a stranger a gift.)
- When God chose to send His Son to live and die for our redemption, everything changed.
 Without Jesus, we would never have a reason for rejoicing. (Children everywhere need to be able to rejoice.)

Luke 2:10 says, "Do not be afraid, for behold, I bring you good tidings of GREAT JOY which will be to ALL PEOPLE. The angel brought a message of joy. "GOOD NEWS!" News that all the world would have joy in.

We rejoice because we have God's love and the hope of eternal life with Him. When we are saved, Joy is God's gift to us.

After journeying through this study of Joy, it makes perfect sense why Operation Christmas Child talks about Joy and why we pack shoeboxes.

GOOD NEWS = Jesus coming to earth and dying for you and for me
GREAT JOY = our Salvation
